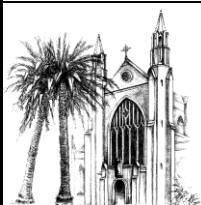

LENT

The Red Cloth on the Altar – is a reminder that the Jesus in the Temple paid taxes to support ongoing sacrifices in the Temple. Two animals were killed every day as a ritual to forgive sin. This is the background to Jesus' actions in the Temple – Jesus' actions are a powerful prophetic symbol announcing the end of such Temple sacrifices. With the coming of Jesus a building made of stone is no longer needed to reconcile us with God.

'SNAPSHOT FROM HISTORY'

Holy Rosary has a strong tradition of embracing all faiths and cultures. Over the years, mass has been said by Italian, Maltese and Lithuanian and Orthodox priests. For a time in the 60s, the Anglican priest would hold a service in the Catholic church. Some of the great contributors of the church were not Catholic. One venture that came out of this ecumenism was the M.A.C.S. Op Shop. The Macauley Road shop was staffed by parishioners from the four denominations represented in the title - Methodist, Anglican, Catholic, Salvation Army.
