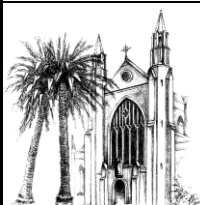

The Social Justice Statement is titled "For those who've come across the seas: justice for refugees and asylum seekers". For years Australian society has been divided by the debate over asylum seekers particularly those who arrive by boat. 'The globalisation of indifference' has emerged in Australia. It is an indifference to the reasons behind people's flight from persecution, and torture, to the human dignity of every person, and to our once proud tradition of protecting and supporting victims of war and violence.</p> <p>Jesus embraced the outsider and the exile as a person like himself and he commands us to do as he did.
