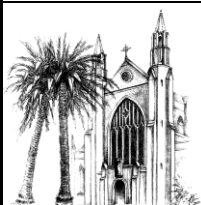

**MIGRANT & REFUGEE SUNDAY - 30 AUGUST 2015**

The theme chosen by Pope Francis for the 101st World Day for Migrants and Refugees is: **Church without frontiers, Mother to all.**

In his message, Pope Francis reminds everyone that, "The Church opens her arms to welcome all people, without distinction or limits, in order to proclaim that 'God is love'" (1 Jn 4:8, 16).

Jesus asks the people in the Gospel, and also to us, 'look at what you do'. Are our values in order? The social teaching of the church echoes the teaching of Jesus and offers us vital parameters to order our values. "I was a stranger and you welcomed me", "Whenever you did this for one of the least of my followers you did to me". (Mt 25:35-40).

- This 101st World Day of Migrant and Refugees let us be aware that 51.3 million people are displaced globally;
- Three million refugees have been produced by the Syrian war;
- Six and a half million, or one-third, of Syrian people are displaced;
- Half of these refugees are children.

As people of faith, are our values in order? What do the values of today's Gospel say to us as we celebrate World Day of Migrants and Refugees in Australia?
